PRACHICAL COURSES

Beginners sailing RYA levels 1 & 2

These two-day sailing courses cater for both adults and children 16 and over. Whether you are a complete beginner or have attended a taster session you can develop your skills with these courses.

At the end of these courses, you should be able to sail safely and independently in light conditions, and subject to suitable progress, you should obtain your RYA Level 1 or 2 certificate. The syllabus will include helming (steering) and crewing a dinghy on all points of sailing, rigging, launching and recovery, approaching jetties up and down wind, man overboard.





Beginners sailing RYA level 1 (keelboat)

This two day course is for beginners who have done little or no sailing before. It is the first part of the RYA training scheme and its aim is to provide basic boat handling techniques and essential background knowledge. By the end of the course you will be able to sail safely under supervision.

Beginners sailing RYA level 2 (keelboat)

This is the second part of the RYA training scheme and is for those who have completed RYA level 1, or have equivalent experience. Its aim is to consolidate your basic knowledge of sailing and develop an awareness of safety. By the end of the course you will be capable of sailing without an instructor on board in light winds.

Improving sailing RYA level 3 (keelboat)

This is the third part of the RYA training scheme and is for those who have completed RYA level 2 and had a season actively sailing or have equivalent experience. Its aim is to enhance your skills and develop your techniques with a range of tasters from the advanced modules. After the course you will be more confident in sailing skills and techniques and ready to progress onto the advanced modules.

RYA Powerboat level 2 course

This course is an introduction to power boating and is run using the club safety craft. It is aimed at complete beginners and by the end of the course you will have covered all practical and theory requirements to safely pilot a powerboat in protected waters. You will get the opportunity to learn skills both on a variety of craft. Subject to suitable progress you will gain your powerboat level two (tidal endorsement) which enables you to apply to the RYA for your ICC (International Certificate of Competence). This is a requirement to use power craft in Europe.

RYA Safety boat course

This is a weekend course for the experienced powerboat handler who provides safety cover for water sports activities. Training covers rescue techniques for dinghies, canoes and windsurfers leading to the RYA Safety Boat Certificate. The RYA Powerboat Level 2 Qualification or an equivalent is a prerequisite, preferably with a further season's experience. This course is being put on primarily for existing safety boat crews to upgrade the quality of safety boat cover for SYC dinghy racing and Sailability training, and these skippers will be given priority in booking for this course

RYA Young sailors course

The RYA Young Sailors Scheme has been developed to encourage young people to learn to sail in stages within a sound framework of safety and tuition. No time limits are given for the different stages, as children learn at very different rates, according to their age and enthusiasm. With each of the stages expressed in terms of competencies, it gives instructors the flexibility to sign off each part of the syllabus as competence in that skill is demonstrated. Nobody can fail – they may just need a little more time and experience. Certificates are not awarded simply for attending a course. If your child falls into this category, we do not want them to feel they have failed in any way. Our aims are to ensure they will have had a lot of fun, learn a great deal and want to continue sailing in the future.

Stage 1

Aged 8+ The syllabus for this stage will be covered in the first two days of the course. You should be able to launch a dinghy and get under way, steer and turn a dinghy when sailing, tie figure of eight knots, be happy in the water wearing personal buoyancy.

Stage 2

Aged 8+ This three day course follows on from stage 1 and will develop your sailing skills along the syllabus as found in RYA Young Sailors Logbook G11. Pre-requisite is stage 1 or other suitable experience.

Stage 3 & 4

Aged 11+ This course will move further on with the RYA Start Sailing syllabus, covering the stages 3 and 4 as appropriate to each individual. By the end we hope to have everyone confidently sailing a dinghy in light wind conditions. Stage 3 will be in single handers with stage 4 moving to double handers introducing the skills of crewing. It is unlikely that stage 3 and 4 will be achievable in one week. If your aim is to get both certificates, repeating this course would be the way forward.

All these courses are run simultaneously during our Young Sailors' Week in the summer. The minimum age for this course is 8 years old. All participants must become cadet members at a cost of £54.

SHOREBASED COURSES

RYA Day skipper theory

A comprehensive introduction to chart work, navigation and the basics of seamanship. This is an elementary course, suitable for beginners and people with little experience. You will find this course invaluable if you want to learn how to start making decisions on board and if you are considering taking the Day Skipper practical course.

The course includes exercises, which will mostly be done as homework – you should allow sufficient time for this. There are also 2 assessment papers to be sat during the course.

As you will be based in the Yacht Club, you will meet likeminded Club Members whose passion is boating. Many skippers are looking for crew to club race and rallying and if you become a Member you can join the Crew Register and get an opportunity to sail on these craft.

The course fee includes all training materials from the RYA.

However, you will require your own plotting equipment – a

Breton/Portland or Parallel Rules and a set of Dividers. You can
either purchase these from a local chandler, or given at least a
week's notice ahead of your course commencing, may be
ordered through Sussex Yacht Club.

RYA Coastal skipper and yachtmaster theory

This is an advanced classroom based course in navigation and meteorology for candidates for the Coastal Skipper and Yacht master Offshore Certificate. The syllabus makes some provisions for the revision of subjects in the Day Skipper Course but those who have not acquired the knowledge set out in the Day Skipper Course are unlikely to be able to assimilate all the subjects covered in this advanced course in the time available. On successful completion of the course, you will have sufficient background knowledge to skipper a yacht on coastal passages by day and night.

As you will be based in the Yacht Club, you will meet like minded Club Members whose passion is boating. Many skippers are looking for crew to club race and rallying and if you become a Member you can join the crew register and get an opportunity to sail on these craft.

RYA First aid at sea

The course is designed to provide a working knowledge of first aid for skippers of small craft working within 60 miles of a safe haven. The syllabus is based on the recommendations of the Health and Safety Executive and the Department of Transport. Upon successful completion of the course an RYA First Aid Certificate is issued valid for 3 years. This certificate fulfils the requirements of the Department of Transport Code of Practice for Small Commercial Vessels in area category 2, 3 & 4

RYA Marine Radio SRC Course & Exam

This course covers VHF communications, radio equipment, GMDSS operation and procedures and VHF procedures and regulations. There is a written test and a practical test on voice procedures, operation of a DSC controller and VHF Marine Band regulations in the GMDSS, with particular emphasis on distress and urgency procedures.

When you pass the Assessments the Certificate is administered and issued by the RYA. The actual Certificate is usually sent to you within 4 weeks of attending the course.

Course cost includes the course book (G31) which will be sent to you prior to the course date.

An exam fee of £76 per person is payable directly to the RYA prior to the course date.

Astro Navigation

This course is for students interested in the sextant and how to use it for navigation at sea. Students will need some basic navigation skills such as those from the RYA Day Skipper Course and be able to plot latitude and longitude and measure bearing and distance on a chart. Some simple arithmetic and chartwork will be used. The course will be partly classroom theory and partly practical sessions on a public beach a short walk away.

What the course covers:

- The sextant: how it works, how to check for errors and how to use it to measure angles.
- Measured angles for coastal navigation.
- Terrestrial and celestial objects.
- The nautical almanac and sight reduction tables (AP3270)
- How to prepare a "sight" and work out a position line.

By the end of the course students should be able to check a sextant for errors, make various measurements and use the results to determine a position line at sea. Some students may go on to the RYA Yachtmaster Ocean course or continue self-study to practice and better understand the sextant.

RYA Radar course

Radar is an invaluable aid for navigation and collision avoidance but it is most useful in the hands of a knowledgeable operator. This is a one-day course popular with those on both sailing and motorboats.

Sailing and motor yachts increasingly have radar on board, and the aim of this course is to teach students to use small boat radar to assist in navigation, pilotage and avoiding collision.

The course concentrates on getting a picture and how to best interpret it. Content includes: how it works (simplified), using the controls, understanding the screen, getting the best picture, avoiding collision, pilotage, navigation, radar reflectors and radar beacons.

The course is taught with the aid of radar simulator programs which allow for students to practice on exercises during the day. No previous experience with radar is needed, and those with radar already will be able to apply the course ideas to their own equipment. As with all courses, some prior reading will be an advantage, and a number of books including the RYA "Introduction to Radar" are available through SYC, chandlers and other suppliers.

Course Objective:

After the course you should have sufficient knowledge, that with practice, you will be able to use the radar to help with collision risk assessment and navigation in reduced visibility. An RYA Radar course completion certificate will be issued at the end of the course

Applications:

Please send applications as soon as possible on the booking form provided. Many of the courses have limited numbers, so you are advised to check availability with the Yacht Club office. Bookings will be acknowledged in writing. Joining details will be sent two weeks before commencement of the course.

Cancellation:

If you cancel, please let the Yacht Club office know as early as possible and confirm in writing the same day. The following refunds will be made:

Cancellations made more than 30 days before the start of the course:

- Full refund less £25 or 50% of the course fee, whichever is smaller.
- No refund will be given for cancellations made less than 14 days before the start of the course.

The Club reserves the right to:

- Cancel a course, should the numbers fail to reach a viable minimum number. A transfer or full refund will be made.
- Request that a participant who does not meet the course criteria to withdraw.

Transfers:

We understand that in exceptional circumstances, you may need to postpone your course. We will transfer
your booking to an alternative date with the following administration charges being made; First transfer –
Free. Further transfers - £30. The Club reserves the right to request that you attend on an under subscribed

Many of our courses can be physically demanding and you should ensure that you have an adequate level of fitness for the activities to be undertaken. Should you suffer from any disability please disclose its nature with your application.

It is recommended that all candidates for waterborne activities should be able to swim 50 metres in light clothing. All course members must comply with safety regulations and instructions of the training staff.
